PRICE TRANSPARENCY: WHO WINS?

The Benjamin Rush Institute (BRI) is an environment that harbors free-thinking people. It is a collective of people that no longer accepts waiting on bureaucrats to improve healthcare. This characteristic provided me with an outlet to question our healthcare system.

I had the privilege of attending the Free Market Medicine Conference, under a grant provided by BRI. With that grant, I was able to travel to Oklahoma City and learn more about the Surgery Center of Oklahoma. I learned through Keith Smith M.D., founder of the Surgery Center of Oklahoma, that a cash-based surgical practice can be sustainable in today's healthcare system. Dr. Smith also gave myself and other BRI members invaluable advice on starting our own free-market practice.

An important entrepreneurial lesson I learned was of the importance in keeping your prices transparent for patients. That way, patients are allowed to shop around for their care, and can thus make the best decision regarding surgeon quality and cost. This type of transparency is rare in the United States healthcare system, and can give your practice an advantage in the market.

Perhaps the biggest lesson I learned, though, was of the need to network with like-minded people in this small niche of healthcare. If you're going to commit yourself to establishing a free-market practice such as the Surgery Center of Oklahoma, you'll need allies whom you can bounce your ideas off of. BRI members can serve that need.

The thought of going against the grain like physicians have in cash-based practices, seemed overwhelming. But after seeing how happy and effective these entrepreneurs have been with restoring the physician-patient relationship, it now seems easier to start my own practice than join the overly-expensive and convoluted healthcare system we have today.

Donations this year allowed us to provide scholarships for seven medical students to the FMMA conference. Next year we want to send twenty! But we can't do it without your help. With more and more physicians losing confidence in free enterprise solutions and resigning themselves to single-payer, it's imperative we expose our future doctors to the far superior alternatives that FMMA promotes.

When doctors practice without unnecessary third-party interference, patients win, too.
